- \$76/credit hour for residents
- \$317/credit hour for non-residents

### Financial Aid

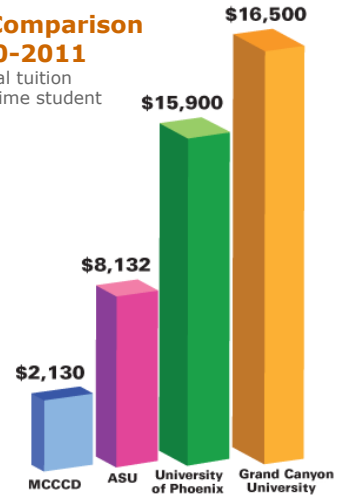
Financial aid helps students pay for educational expenses: tuition, fees, books, supplies, and even living expenses.

- **Grants** - Financial aid that does not need to be repaid
- **Loans** - Borrowed money that must be repaid with interest
- **Work Study** - Earn money while working on campus
- **Scholarships** - Donated funds that do not need to be repaid
- **Military Aid** - Montgomery GI Bill and ROTC are two examples of resources available to military veterans and recruits
- **Tuition Reimbursement** - Many employers offer tuition reimbursement programs for employees, and sometimes, children of employees, so check with your employer today.
